

Position Description

The Research Centre of CHUM (CRCHUM) in partnership with the Faculty of Medicine of the Université de Montréal (UdeM) and the Centre d'expertise des victimes de brûlures graves de l'Ouest du Québec (CEVBGOQ) is seeking applicants for an assistant or associate research professor in the burn care research field.

The candidate must have competencies and experience related to basic research on burn care, regenerative medicine, tissue engineering and/or control of infection in burn injuries.

The candidate will have to take advantage of her/his expertise to establish a basic research program dedicated to the field of burn care. It is expected that the candidate will work in close collaboration with the CEVBGOQ to foster knowledge translation and strengthen research capacities in the field.

As researcher at CRCHUM, the new principal investigator will join a stimulating research environment with cutting-edge technologies. Competitive recruitment conditions (with a salary support and start-up funds) will be offered according to the experience of the candidate.

Responsibilities

The research professor will be responsible for:

- ✓ Development and realization of an active fundamental research program in burn care research
- ✓ Supervision of students including medical residents and graduate students
- ✓ The new investigator will contribute to some administrative and academic activities at CRCHUM and teaching at UdeM
- ✓ Contribution to the scientific community and academic life of the CRCHUM and department
- ✓ Reinforcement of research capacities and knowledge transfer in clinical training settings.

Qualifications

Applicants must:

- ✓ Hold a Ph.D. degree in an appropriate discipline with postdoctoral experience and strong publication record
- ✓ Demonstrate his/her motivation to develop an innovative and externally funded research program in the field of burn care research and to establish collaborations with other researchers of the CRCHUM Immunopathology research theme
- ✓ Good knowledge of the healthcare system in Canada/Quebec
- ✓ Communication skills in French and English (oral and written) are assets*.

- ✓ A letter of interest describing their proposed research program in the field of interest and explaining how their previous training supports this program
- ✓ A curriculum vitae
- ✓ The names of three references (applicant agreement will be sought before contacting the reference names provided).
